Your Beatitude,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of life and resurrection.

We have been closely following the dramatic developments on the ground following the devastating earthquake that struck Syria and Turkey. We are deeply saddened by the news that over 40,000 people have lost their lives, and tens of thousands more have been injured and left homeless. For many, this is the second or even third time they have been displaced in their lives. This has left millions of people in a state of shock and despair. Please accept our heartfelt sympathies and solidarity.

Your Beatitude's prompt call for solidarity with those affected by the disaster, as well as the immediate action taken by the Greek Orthodox Patriarchate of Antioch and All the East in providing aid and transforming church facilities into shelters for those who have lost their homes, are beacons of hope in these trying times. Your Beatitude's resilience and unwavering faith in the face of adversity inspire and encourage us, and we are committed to doing our part in easing the suffering caused by this calamity. Our thoughts and prayers are with Your Beatitude as Your Beatitude navigates through this challenging period, and we continue to stand in solidarity with Your Beatitude, now as we have always done in the past. In this context, ACT Alliance has issued an urgent appeal that addresses many immediate needs and the WCC member churches are responding massively to this appeal. As a fellowship of churches, we are "to express the common concern of the churches in the service of human need, the breaking down of barriers between people and the promotion of one human family in justice and peace." (WCC Constitution).

We recognize the profound impact of this disaster, especially as Your Beatitude continues to grapple with the ongoing challenges of conflict, displacement, and economic hardship. We stand with Your Beatitude in prayer and support, as Your Beatitude works to recover and rebuild in the wake of this tragedy. We are confident that Your Beatitude's Church's diaconal actions will strengthen the historical and human ties between Christians and Muslims in Syria, as well as in the entire region. We learn from Your Beatitude's courage and steadfastness when Your Beatitude remains rooted in faith and promotes Christian ethical values in such critical moments.

We pray our Lord Jesus Christ to give Your Beatitude all the strength and comfort Your Beatitude needs to support the suffering and vulnerable people, and we are fully confident that Your Beatitude will emerge from this challenge stronger than ever before. Be assured that the entire ecumenical family holds Your Beatitude constantly in prayer. This is an imperative of costly solidarity within the one body of Christ.
