

Religious Leaders Unite for Climate Peace in Solidarity with Refugees

At the 2023 Global Refugee Forum (GRF), UNHCR will be hosting regionally diverse religious leaders, faith representatives and institutions to build on their strong contributions and collaboration with each other through inter-religious dialogue.

UNHCR and Religions for Peace (RfP) created the first-ever Multi-Religious Council of Leaders (MRCL) in 2020. Work with religious leaders and institutions continues with UNHCR's long-term partners, and the World Council of Churches (WCC), to address the root causes of conflict, displacement, and statelessness by promoting reconciliation, conflict prevention, and peacebuilding.

Building on significant faith-based engagement and efforts at COP28 in the UAE, the GRF-linked event will continue to build inter-religious synergies for solidarity and support for climate-related displacement, allowing religious leaders and faith actors to share their individual and collective commitments.

Expected Outcome

Increased solidarity with and support for dynamic ways for religious leaders and faith actors to support the implementation of the Global Compact on Refugees, Climate Peace in solidarity with Refugees through inter-religious dialogue and cooperation.
