The Ecumenical Institute at Bossey, part of the World Council of Churches and attached to the University of Geneva, invites emerging and senior scholars from diverse Christian traditions to join an international conference that delves into the ecumenical significance of the First Ecumenical Council of Nicaea (325 AD) and its relevance in today's rapidly changing world. Discuss the role of theological education in nurturing an ecumenical mindset.

**Target Audience:** The conference welcomes theologians, students, and individuals interested in Nicaea and its outcomes and implications as well as in ecumenical theological education.

**Conference Format:** The conference invites keynote addresses by renowned scholars and paper presentations.

**Deadline for Abstracts:** Submit your abstracts by latest 28 March 2024. Accepted papers will be published in a conference proceedings volume.
